After Graduation:

You will be a commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the United States Army. Next, you will go to the Basic Officer Leadership Course, where you will study basic Army knowledge and the functioning of an Army unit. You will go to your first duty assignment which can be anywhere in the continental U.S., Alaska, Hawaii, Germany, or Korea. Your first assignment is determined by evaluating your college performance, ROTC standing, and your preferences.

Service obligation:

- Scholarship recipients:
 - Your total obligation will be eight years (the first four are full time active duty service). The remaining four years, you may elect to continue on active duty or enter in the Inactive Ready Reserves (IRR),
- Non-Scholarship recipients:
 - Your total service obligation will be eight years (the first three year will be full time active duty service). The remaining five years, you may elect to continue on active duty or enter the Army Reserve, which is part time service.
- National Guard and Army Reserves:
 - With or without scholarships, your total service obligation will be eight years, you will attend drills one per weekend per month. The last two years are optional Inactive Ready Reserve.

Scholarship:

A wide variety of SCHOLARSHIPS from .5 to 4 years are offered from both the Army ROTC Cadet Command, National Guard, and the Reserves for your service to your nation following graduation from college.

Student requirements for the Army ROTC:

- Have a CGPA of 3.0 or higher
- Minimum ACT of 19 or 990 SAT required (can be waived)
 - Maintain full time student enrollment (enrolled in a Military Science course each semester)
 - At least 12 hours of undergraduate studies per semester
 - At least 9 hours of graduate studies per semester
- Graduate prior to year of your 31st birthday (potentially waiverable)
- Pass a medical examination
- Pass an Extensive Background Check
- Pass a physical fitness test (2minutes of Pushups, 2minute of situps, and a 2mile run)
- Become an Army 2nd Lieutenant upon graduation. Your choice of:
 - Active Duty Army (Must be assessed by national board)
 - National Guard
 - o Army Reserves

The Scholarship pays:

- Tuition and Fees or Room and Board for \$5000 per semester
- Book allowance = \$600 per semester
- Monthly stipend
